

KRT KIDS present *DISNEY'S FINDING NEMO JR* REHEARSAL AND PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE:

- AUDITIONS: Saturday May 20th from 2pm-5pm.
- FIRST REHEARSAL: Monday June 5th from 10am-2pm
 - Parent/Guardian Meeting: The first 30 minutes we invite all parents/guardians to come in for a meeting to introduce the crew, gather information, and ask any questions they have.
 - Headshots: We also will be doing Headshots this day and asked all participants to please wear a solid black shirt (no graphics or logos please) and come ready to get their picture done.
 - Volunteers: We are also in need of Parent volunteers for the run of the entire rehearsal schedule to help primarily with crafts and managing the kids throughout the 4 hr. timeframe. We seek a minimum of 3-4 volunteers for each day.
- JUNE 5TH JULY 25TH: Rehearsals will be held on Mondays and Tuesdays 10am-2pm
 - Holiday: We will take the entire week of July 4th off.
 - Packed Lunches: Participants will need to bring their own lunch and snack during these days.
- **SOFT TECHNICAL (TECH) REHEARSALS:** Will begin and run July 31st, August 1st, and August 2nd 10am-2pm. During these 3 days we're asking for parent volunteers to bring in meals for the cast.
 - What is a tech rehearsal? "Tech rehearsals are the time that actors take a back seat for a while. Not completely, but almost. It's the time for music, lights, sound, props and costume departments to sort out what they must do to make the show pop." Royal Shakespeare Company
- **TECH WEEK:** Will begin the week after soft tech and will run August 8th, 9th, and 10th from 4pm-7pm with the 7th being OFF considering its Pendleton County School's opening day. We will also be asking for parent volunteers to bring in a meal for the cast for these rehearsals.
 - Base Costume: Participants will need to provide themselves with a plain black T-shirt, black pants, and black jazz shoes for the run of the show as their "base" costume.



- STRIKE: Will be held on Sunday, August 20th immediately after the ending of the show. ALL Students must participate in assisting with the cleanup. A Cast Party will then be held when Strike has been completed and will last for an hour.
 - What is strike? Strike is when we clean-up the theatre after the final performance. Strike can include set deconstruction. It also includes the removal props and costumes from the stage, the cleaning and clearing of the dressing room, and generally tidying up the theatre.
